Appendix I: Household Income Guidelines Charts

FEDERAL POVERTY GUIDELINES

Income guidelines are revised annually. The following chart displays income levels by household size for the 2021-2022 (July 1 – March 31) program year and should be used to determine eligibility. Clients are eligible if their total household income is at or below 175% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

HEAP Income Eligibility (175% of Federal Poverty Guidelines)

Households with more than eight members should add \$7,945 to the yearly income or \$653.01 to the 30-day income for each additional member.

PIPP Income Eligibility (150% of Federal Poverty Guidelines)

Households with a gross annual household income at or below 150% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines are eligible to participate in PIPP. See current income eligibility chart below.
